ELIGIBILITY METHODOLOGY

The Coordinating Council for Workforce Development (CCWD), in consultation with the State Workforce Development Board (SWDB), identified the occupations that were **high-skill**, **high-wage**, or **in-demand** based on the following criteria:



HIGH-SKILL

Occupations in SC with education or training requirements of:



Completion of an apprenticeship program



Associate degree, or higher



Industry-recognized certification or credential



HIGH-WAGE

Occupations that pay at least the median hourly or median annual wage for SC.

To meet this definition, an occupation must have:



A median hourly wage of at least \$21.52, or



A median annual wage of at least \$44,760



IN-DEMAND

Occupations in SC with more than the median number of total annual job openings projected through 2034.

To meet this definition, an occupation must have:



At least 61 total annual job openings

This list of **high-skill**, **high-wage**, or **in-demand** occupations was then refined to include occupations that align with selected South Carolina Workforce Industry Needs Scholarship (SC WINS) programs. A CIP to SOC (program to occupation) crosswalk was used to map these programs to associated occupations, resulting in the pilot list of 24 occupations eligible for Workforce Pell shown above.
